

Let us dance as sisters and brothers with the Spirit of Pentecost as we humbly submit to do Thy will. Let us pray to the Lord.





to Promote Environmental Justice and Heal Climate-Impacted Communities

Chicago has a long history of some of the nation's highest rates of asthma and lead levels in the African American community. The historic, deadly Heat Wave of 1995 disproportionately impacted Chicago-area seniors of color. Participants in the 2nd Annual Climate and Environmental Justice Conference, sponsored by the Archdiocese of Chicago's Black Catholic Initiative, will both experience Healing Touch, a Green/Judeo-Christian spiritual healing technique, and learn how to use it to remediate environmental and climate health problems. Complimentary sessions are being provided by the newly formed 501 (c) 3 Franciscan charity *Healing Touch of Tau*. Please see the Introduction to Healing Touch video at the Download link here:

Dr. Washington is a formally trained Healing Touch Practitioner. Part of her journey as a Secular Franciscan in faith-based environmental health activism is the use of non-invasive and non-pharmaceutical based health care for marginalized and high risk environmental/climate justice communities. The sessions offered are ideal for members of communities with high rates of asthma, COPD, lead poisoning, diabetes, mercury exposure, and cardiovascular disease. The sessions are also ideal for those who live within 30 miles of coal fired power plants, live in housing built before 1946, or have a family history of eating fish caught in the Great Lakes. Participants will receive:

- A 20 to 30 minute complimentary Green Healing Session.
- Training in how to administer this form of Green Healing to themselves, family and community members, and friends.



Join Korean-American scholar, Fr. Simon C. Kim, on Thursday, October 6, as he examines the Catholic Church's response to racism since Vatican II...and how changing attitudes will help, or hinder, the outlook on race relations both here in the U.S. and around the globe.

Why is the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops planning to release a pastoral letter on racism in 2018, nearly 40 years after their last statement? Will this statement help us navigate the recent struggles dividing our communities? This talk will examine the Catholic Church's response to racism since Vatican II and how changing attitudes will help or hinder the outlook of race relations not only in this country but throughout the world.

Speaker: A Korean-American scholar, Fr. Simon C. Kim is a theologian of culture; he strives to make faith generationally and culturally relevant, drawing on his own experience of church and identity. He's the author of several books, including A World Church in Our Backyard and An Immigration of Theology.


