




We honor Kwanzaa and its values, as we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family and a call to faithful love, devoted attachment, and unity.

Every year from December 26th to January 1st, many African Americans celebrate **Kwanzaa-**which means "the first fruits of the harvest." The holiday is modeled after the first-fruits harvest celebrations that happened across the African continent since antiquity.

Kwanzaa reinforces seven principles which are:

- 1. Umoja: Unity
- 2. Kujichagulia: Self-determination
- 3. Ujima: Collective Work & Responsibility
- 4. Ujamaa: Cooperative Economics
- 5. Nia: Purpose
- 6. Kuumba: Creativity
- 7. Imani: Faith
